Take Away Homework Menu – (Autumn Term 2)

Choose your homework from the menu below. The sun rating suggests the difficulty or challenge the homework may offer. This half term you must complete 2 tasks of your choice. One task should be from the 3 sun rating. I expect high quality work which shows research, thought and care with presentation – something you can be very proud of! Bring your work back to school on **Wednesday 21st December** to share with the class and the rest of KS2. We want to see evidence of your plans the **week beginning 28th November**.

	Make your own 'shadow clock'. You could bring it into school or just a photograph! Some people believe this is why stone circles were built – to tell the time!
	Take a photograph of yourself reading your favourite book in your favourite place. We will hang these in our reading cave!
	Write a diary entry in role as a Stone Age Child. How might you spend your day? Remember to include all the features of a diary.

 	Go 'Geocaching' with your family! Geocaching is a real-world, outdoor treasure hunting game using GPS-enabled devices. Participants navigate to a specific set of GPS coordinates and then attempt to find the geocache (container) hidden at that location. The app is free to download and apparently there are some hidden in Bunbury! You have to look really carefully – sometimes they are hidden under rocks/inside tree trunks! Take photographs of your adventure!
 	Make a timeline to show the 3 parts of the Stone Age. This can be made out of anything you like e.g. paper with flaps, sticks and stones, draw it on the ground and take a picture, zig-zag booklet etc.
 	Create a fact booklet about Stonehenge. This could be a zig-zag book, pop-up book, window book (like the ones we made in class), poster etc. If you need instructions to make one of the books please just ask!

  	Make a model of Stonehenge. This can be made out of any materials you wish and any size. For example: lego, rocks and grass, chocolate fingers, Bourbons, marshmallows, card, clay, paper mache etc...!
  	Make a short piece of film about one aspect of Stone Age life (hunting, cooking etc). This could be you acting out, or simply recalling some facts – be creative! Please bring the film to school on a USB stick to share with the class.
  	Make some Stone Age jewellery. What do you think Stone Age people wore as jewellery? Do some research! Clay/plastercine maybe good materials to make your jewellery from.
