

the children have arrived safely and on time to all their sessions.

We have also had a number of visitors in school this week to work in school. On Thursday we welcomed PC Andrew Cornall into school to lead an Online Safety workshop for parents. I know the parents who attended found it extremely useful, informative and supportive in navigating our way as around the online world with our children. PC Cornalls information was well received and he has offered to run a second session early next school year for those parents who were unable to attend. A further letter will be sent out over the next few weeks with some of the

materials discussed today. A number of our children have their own mobile phone and devices and I am conscious that nowadays most children have these at an earlier age than previously. However with the owning of such devices comes the responsibility of using it appropriately and with respect to others.

It is clearly not school's decision as to when a child is given a mobile phone nor our responsibility as to what APPs the children are using. I do draw your attention however to the APPS and their Age ratings graphic below. PC Cornall also emphasised the importance of keeping phones/tablets etc out of bedrooms, bathrooms etc so that the sites,



activity and online connections they are making can be monitored and checked upon for suitability.

Unfortunately, we do often see issues from irresponsible use of mobile phones coming back into school along with a lack of understanding and appreciation as to how to use a mobile phone responsibly. This lack of understanding can leave our children extremely vulnerable to their peers and online predators. Difficulties can take the form of comments made on social media after school hours, inappropriate messaging, photos and sexting and can lead to much more distressing scenarios developing.



We also welcomed Music For Life into school during an

assembly this week. During the session with the children they talked to the children about the opportunities for music tuition in school from Year 2. Should your child be interested in music lessons in school please refer to the letter sent out this week with further details for booking.

Earlier in the week we welcomed Louise Cook into our Year 6 classroom to talk to the children as we prepare for the SATs tests next week. The children took part in a workshop with activities to alleviate stress and promote well-being.

Next week our Year 6 children will sit their end of Key Stage 2 SATs papers in reading, maths and SPAG. Over the past few weeks and months they have worked incredibly hard in preparation for these tests and I am extremely proud of each and every one of them.For some, this week will be quite challenging, emotionally some will be on a rollercoaster and for others they will take it in their stride. As their head teacher, but also a parent, I know that it is not an easy week and there is something they all need to remember.

The SATs tests do not test what makes our children special and unique. They do not know that they sing, dance and are extremely creative. They do not measure how kind they are to their friends or how they look after their classmates. They do not know how far they can run, how well they can ride a horse or how many goals they have scored. They do not know that they have overcome hurdles and obstacles in their life and they certainly do not test how special, unique and amazing they are as individuals. The results from these tests will tell them something, but not everything. They will not define them as an individual; personality, kindness, empathy are far more important at the end of the day.

I would also personally like to thank Miss Hickson for all her work this year with the children in year 6. Having taught year 6 myself for many years I know how much time and energy is given to ensure each pupil achieves their potential. I am sure that once again you'll agree that Miss Hickson has given, as with all teachers at Bunbury, 110% to the class of 2023.



Today we celebrated the coronation of King Charles in school. 
