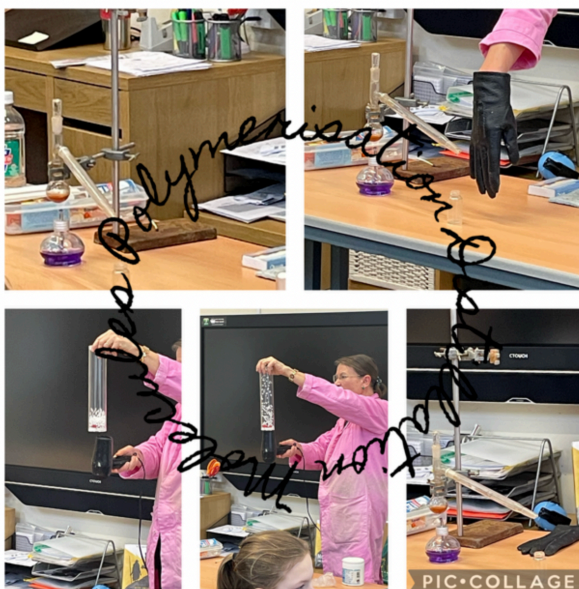

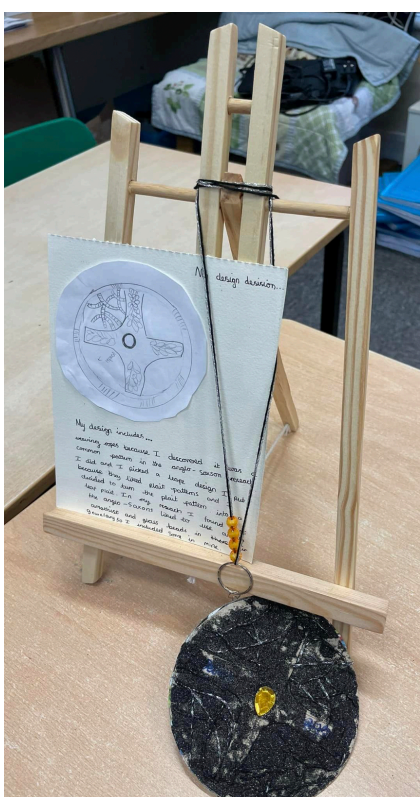
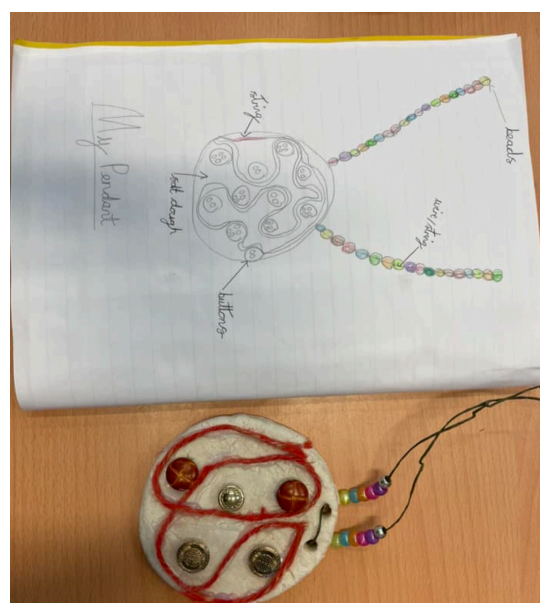

School Lane Traffic

As you will be aware the school work hard to promote safer streets around Bunbury in relation to safe and considerate parking. There are often regular reminders via text, email and offending vehicles are often shared on the newsletter. We hope that with a continued campaign we can all park safely and respectfully around the streets of Bunbury during the busy times of drop off and pick up. Recently, I have also been

made aware of a campaign led by a Parish council committee to reduce the speed limit through Bunbury Village. **The school are in full support of this campaign and there will be a meeting for any parent wishing to attend on Tuesday 27th February at 6pm in the school hall.**

In the recent survey of the village, there was a lot of support (over 90%) for making Bunbury a cleaner (air?), quieter, and safer place. The Parish Council wants to act upon that broad concern by considering the possibility of introducing a 20 mph zone across all the residential areas of the village. We are starting with this issue because it is often raised with Councillors and indicates a general concern about how our life in Bunbury is developing. 1934, the 30 mph speed limit was introduced as the best guess for vehicles travelling through towns and villages. Then, there were less than 3 million vehicles on the road. Now, we have nearly 34 million. It is time for a rethink, and part of that was expressed in the same village survey when residents voted by 96% for a rebalance of the relationship between pedestrians, cyclists, and vehicles.

The simplest and cheapest way to do this – a critical issue for local governments everywhere- is to change the 30 mph speed restriction signs at the entry points of the village to 20 mph. Once in the village all drivers would know the maximum speed is 20 mph until the signs tell them differently. Why do we need an 'Advisory Speed Restriction' of 20 mph when children go to and from school but not the rest of the time? Why, when the pavements shrink and disappear, do walkers still face cars legally travelling at a speed that will kill or seriously injure them when 20 mph adds little to journey times and makes pedestrians much safer?

We need to confirm that the whole village supports this suggestion of a 20 mph zone covering the Bunbury. When we ask Cheshire East to implement such a scheme, and it only at their say so, they will rightly expect us to have unambiguous evidence that we have the community behind us. Therefore, we intend to gather the data through a survey of every house, including all adults and children, to test our proposition so that no one can say they were not asked, and the result will speak for itself; with this in mind we urge you to show your support by completing the survey on this matter which will be delivered to you in the coming month from the parish council'



Attendance

Attendance at school is important both academically and for social/emotional reasons. The Government have launched a national campaign to remind parents and carers of the importance of school attendance. The campaign aims to primarily reach those parents and carers whose children are taking preventable odd days of absence – or “avoidable absence” – rather than children who face greater barriers to attendance, such as those with long term medical needs or special educational needs and disabilities.

The NHS and the Chief Medical Officer say it is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses, including general cold symptoms like a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat.

Whilst we understand that pupils will be absent from time to time due to illness; absence from school for other reasons should only be for exceptional circumstances. I have received an increase in the number of holiday absence requests for holidays. As a school we look at each request for leave from school on a case by case basis and absences in term time will only be permitted under exceptional circumstances. Unless there are exceptional circumstances, holidays taken in term time will be unauthorised and maybe subject to a fine.

Attendance at school enables us all to build a strong team and to strengthen our learning powers. Our overall attendance for whole school is currently **96.66%** which is **1.86%** above the national figure currently at **94.8%** and above other North West schools.

Having good attendance also means being on time and not being late to school. Children who arrive late can feel embarrassed, left out and miss out on important introductions to lessons. Punctuality is an essential life skill that needs to be taught from the very beginning.

From next week we will also be focusing on persistent lateness to school and reminder letters will be sent to parents where there is persistent lateness.

The school day begins at **8.45am** with gates opening at **8.30am** and closing promptly at the start of the school day.

Our attendance officer will be joining us periodically to support the school with our "Late Gate" campaign.

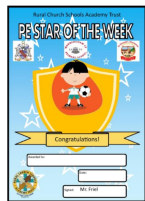
