

This week we have also seen the installation of our temporary heated pool ready for our KS2 swimming lessons over the next 2 weeks. I know the children thoroughly enjoy having the pool onsite and the opportunities having such a temporary facility on site brings for the children of Bunbury. Hopefully all KS2 children have now received notification of their lesson times.

In accordance with the wishes of the Institute of Swimming and Cheshire East Borough Council we would be grateful if you could read and comply with the following:

- For reasons of safety we would prefer the girls to wear one piece costumes and boys to wear swimming trunks rather than baggy shorts.
- Goggles are not necessary within a short swimming lesson and therefore they will only be allowed in exceptional circumstances as we want to encourage children to swim without them and so be better prepared if faced with a real life emergency.
- We would like all children to wear a swim cap for safety and hygiene reasons.

Please could you make sure that for each day of swimming the children have a towel and a pair of flip/flops or sliders. They can also bring a dressing gown or robe to get from the changing space to the pool should

At Bunbury we pride ourselves in a broad and balanced curriculum for all our learners. Through the school year pupils receive regular and consistent teaching in the reading, writing and maths curriculum as well as RE and foundation subjects such as music, geography, history etc. Through the past couple of years we have been working hard through our school development plan to raise not only the profile, consistency and quality of science teaching but the scientific opportunities we provide for our children. One of our successful initiatives in this area is our focused science week in school. This not only provides the pupils with a dedicated week on science in addition to their weekly lessons but also opportunities for them to hear and see how science features in many careers which they may well be considering.

This year we will be holding our science week once again -Tuesday 4th June - Friday 7th June.
The theme this year for British Science Week is 'Time!'
Throughout the week, we would like to invite parents/carers into school to inspire the children with talks/demonstrations about their jobs or science-related hobbies and how they relate to time.
This could be how the profession has changed over time, how time is relevant to your role, how practice has changed over time etc. Volunteers can come from a range of STEM careers engineers, designers, medical professionals, pilots, architects, scientists, technicians etc. Some roles may not be typically linked to science but still very much involve it – chefs, tech start-ups, gardeners, sportspeople etc.

Attendance

Attendance at school is important both academically and for social/emotional reasons. The Government have launched a national campaign to remind parents and carers of the importance of school attendance. The campaign aims to primarily reach those parents and carers whose children are taking preventable odd days of absence – or "avoidable absence" – rather than children who face greater barriers to attendance, such as those with long term medical needs or special educational needs and disabilities.

The NHS and the Chief Medical Officer say it is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses, including general cold symptoms like a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat.

Whilst we understand that pupils will be absent from time to time due to illness; absence from school for other reasons should only be for exceptional circumstances. I have received an increase in the number of holiday absence requests for holidays. As a school we look at each request for leave from school on a case by case basis and absences in term time will only be permitted under exceptional circumstances. Unless there are exceptional circumstances, holidays taken in term time will be unauthorised and maybe subject to a fine.

Attendance at school enables us all to build a strong team and to strengthen our learning powers. Our overall attendance for whole school is currently **96.66%** which is **1.86%** above the national figure currently at **94.8%** and above other North West schools.


Having good attendance also means being on time and not being late to school. Children who arrive late can feel embarrassed, left out and miss out on important introductions to lessons. Punctuality is an essential life skill that needs to be taught from the very beginning.
