**Home learning**

As the lockdown continues staff across the school have been preparing work for our home learning to continue for the next 3 weeks. All work for home learning is posted on the SCHOOL CLOSURE TAB on our website and can be found under the link to your child's class. **Work for the new term will be available on all closure class pages from Monday 20th April.**

This term our theme is 'What a waste' and there are various takeaway projects for each year group linked to this along with maths, writing and spelling resources.



There is also a special challenge from me. You may remember that last year we held our very own Dragon's Den project with the theme 'What can you do with an idea?'

This year the theme to challenge you is **"What can you do with a plastic bottle?"**

There will be a prize for each year group as well as one for the most inventive idea for KS1 and KS2. Get your thinking caps on and see who can come up with the best use of an empty plastic bottle which would otherwise of been thrown away as waste.....

This message is just to reiterate one really important point about learning at home: it is wholly different to a normal school day. I am sure you've all found that. I have!

At my home I have a 4 year old, 13 year old and 14 year old. There have been squabbles, disagreements and refusals to do any work at times. I appreciate how different and at times difficult this can be, so please don't worry about how much you are doing.

### **Communication**

We understand that during this time, parents and children will want to keep in touch with school and teachers as much as possible and we have always encouraged this to continue. We thank those parents who have uploaded photos to our facebook pages and emailed us on the system below.

You will of received information today about our new Bunbury school Padlet which I have set up to aid with communication and sharing of work between staff and children.

Children will be able to upload comments and pictures on to the Padlet page under their class column to show their home learning. Teachers can then add comments, weblinks and extra resources and activities etc in response to the post too. As the length of time we are now going to be apart has been extended this will be an excellent and safe way of sharing and communicating between teachers and pupils.
