We have been working tirelessly to keep children safe since this conflict began eight years ago and we are determined to remain in Ukraine to reach the most vulnerable children and families.


- We are helping to provide families with access to clean water and healthy food.



<u>Uniform</u>

Prior to half term I had noticed that standards in uniform have slipped for some of the children in school. There are though a number of children always dressed smartly and wearing the correct uniform and I thank those parents for upholding the expectations that we have.

There has been an increase in children wearing trainers and boots as well as items which are not part of the school uniform we list.
