### Dear Parents/Carers,

Another week has flown by in school and lots of fantastic teaching and learning continues to take place. All children are now fully immersed in their STEM study theme and it has been a privilege to witness the exciting opportunities taking place.





This week we have held the national statutory tests for our Year 6 pupils.

I am incredibly proud of all the children in Year 6 their composure, maturity and resilience during the week of testing has been incredible. As is tradition at Bunbury for the past 10 years we have ended our week with the Year 6 water fight. Myself, Miss Hickson and Mrs Walker were joined by Rev Tim for the soaking!





I am also aware that across the school there are also children in the following year groups undertaking statutory testing. Children in Year 1, Year 2 and Year 4 will take part in some form of statutory testing over the next few weeks:

- **Year 1 Phonics Screening test**
- Year 2 End of Key Stage 1 tests in reading, writing and maths
- **Year 4 Multiplication tests**

Whilst we may all have very different views on the place of testing within the primary curriculum I would like to ask that the testing process is kept in perspective for the children. All the staff at Bunbury ensure that the children are prepared adequately so that they can achieve their potential and I know that through this year they have worked incredibly hard deepening their learning in preparation for these tests and I am extremely proud of each and everyone of them.

For some, it may be quite challenging, emotionally some may be on a rollercoaster and for others they may take it all in their stride. As their headteacher, and a parent, I know that it is not easy being tested as a child at any age but there is something they need to remember.

None of the tests listed above measure what makes you special and unique. They do not know that you sing, dance and are extremely creative. They do not measure how kind you are to your friends or how you look after your classmates. They do not know how far you can run, how well you can ride a horse or how many goals you have scored. They do not know that you have overcome hurdles and obstacles in your life and they certainly do not test how special, unique and amazing you are as individuals.

## The results from these tests will tell you something, but not everything.

Now the weather is getting warmer, please can I remind you that PE hoodies are now only to be worn on PE days and not as part of the school uniform.

#### **Attendance in School**

We understand that there will be times when absence is unavoidable and acceptable. Each absence is classed as authorised or unauthorised. Absences are coded as authorised where reasons are considered valid and unauthorised where no explanation or unacceptable reasons are given.

The following reasons are for example not acceptable:

- shopping visits
- care for family members
- days out
- parents' work commitments or business trips
- holidays taken in term time (including long weekends taken on Fridays and / or Mondays)
- parental illness
- sleeping in / missing school transport
- birthdays or birthday treats

I am sure you are all aware that term time absence has an undoubted negative impact on a child's learning and through the remaining part of the school year we would ask that any absences are kept to a minimum.

What the law says about school attendance: The law requires all children between the ages of 5 and 16 to be in full time education. Under Section 7 of the Education Act 1996 it is the duty of the parent/carer of a child of compulsory school age to ensure that they attend school regularly.

<u>Supervision Order Children's Act 1989:</u> The local authority can apply to the courts where attendance remains poor. A named education supervisor would be appointed to work with the family for up to 12 months to ensure the young person receives full time education.

<u>School Attendance Order Education Act 1996:</u> If this is issued; parents would be directed to register their child at a school named by the local authority. A warning letter can be issued when a pupil has had 10 or more unauthorised absences from school. The warning letter gives parents a period of 15 days of monitoring. If at the end of this period if there has not been an improvement or an improvement has been made but not sustained, a Penalty Notice will be issued.

Families who take their children out of school for holiday within term time, or for other unauthorised absences exceeding 10 sessions (5 days). A Penalty Notice will be issued.

<u>Penalty Notice</u>: Each parent/carer would have to pay £60.00 per child. If this is not paid within 21 days, the payment increases to £120.00 per child per parent. Payments will not be accepted after 28 days. If

parents do not pay, the Local Authority will prosecute in the Magistrates' Court. If convicted the parent will have a criminal record and may receive a fine of up to £1000.

The department for Education have a range of information available regarding attendance.
