Dear Parents/Carers

I am writing this having just returned from our Harvest Service at St Boniface church this morning. Firstly, I would like to thank all those who walked with us to the church, those who attended the service and for all the generous gifts for the food bank.

I would also like to thank the staff at Bunbury school for all the hard work which went into organising the service. As always I was incredibly proud of our children for their performance today but I was particularly blown away by the environmental song written by our school choir and sung by Year 5. It was incredible.

I am hoping that we can take our message further. I ask that if any parents have any means of recording our song so that we can send it to local radio stations to contact the school office. It would be fantastic to see Bunbury school on the map for such positive reasons.

Parking

As you will be aware over the past year I have had quite an intensive campaign to improve the parking situation outside school at drop off and pick up. I am pleased to say that on the whole parking has improved considerably and most people are now leaving the coned areas clear for safer crossing, and not parking inconsiderately opposite the zig zag lines etc.



However, in the wet weather this week we had a number of people parking inconsiderately around the school. Whilst I appreciate that it was very wet, parking in such a manner in poor weather conditions increases the risk of a potential accident out of school. Particularly when visibility for pedestrians is poor.

Please can I ask that, no matter what the weather, we adhere to the recommendations school have put in place to ensure that all our children are safe coming to and leaving school.

Our pupils at Bunbury feel so strongly about the roads outside of school being safe, that in their spare time they design posters to promote safer parking. Oliver in year 4, has designed this poster which we will turn into leaflets for cars. Along with the Junior road safety officers, Annabel and Savannah (year 6), two apprentices in Year 5 will be leaving leaflets on cars of which they deem to be parked inconsiderately.

We thank Oliver for his leaflet and hope that this helps with our continued campaign for safer roads for the children of Bunbury.

Macmillan Coffee Morning 11th October

Now that we have elected our Head and deputy boys and girls our newly formed school council can begin their work for the year. The first event they will be organising is a **Macmillan Coffee Morning** on **Friday 11th October** from

11am - 12 in the school hall. Any donations of cakes are welcome but please

remember that we have a number of allergies and intolerances in school. **As an inclusive school it would be fantastic to see that all dietary requirements are catered for - dairy, gluten, nut free, coeliac - so that all children can enjoy the morning.**

A Guide to Parking Safely at Our Schools

Inconsiderate and dangerous parking around our schools has become a big problem, putting the safety of children and others at risk. We all want to keep our children safe around schools, so here's some top tips on how you can make a difference.

Did you know?
One in five cars in the morning rush hour is taking children to school

- How Can You Help?**
- ✓ Keep your speed down
 - ✓ Turn your engine off if leaving your vehicle
 - ✓ Leave the middle of the road free, with enough room for other road users to easily pass through
 - ✓ Make sure your child leaves and enters your vehicle safely onto the pavement
 - ✓ Check for pedestrians and cyclists before opening a car door
 - ✓ Leave enough room on pavements for pedestrians to get past
 - ✓ Take care when reversing

- Please Keep Clear...**
- ✓ Zig Zags and School Entrances
 - ✓ Dropped Kerbs
 - ✓ Resident's Driveways
 - ✓ Opposite or within 10 meters of a junction- so that children can see cars and cars can see children


Your questions answered...


Can I double park if I remain in my vehicle?
No, vehicles parked in the middle of a road cause obstruction for all road users and may obstruct the line of sight for pedestrians and children crossing the road.


Am I okay to park on zigzag markings if I am only there a few minutes?
No, under no circumstances should you park on zig zag markings at any time, these are there to protect school entrances and leave a clear view of the street for pedestrians.
