As you will be aware the school received a full section 5 Ofsted inspection this week on Wednesday 8th and Thursday 9th January. The inspection took place under the new inspection schedule which came into place in September 2019.

Although, I am unable to share our final judgement until it has been moderated we are as a school pleased with the outcome. I am however able to say how incredibly proud I am of all the staff and children at the school. Over the past few days all the school staff have worked tirelessly to demonstrate to the inspectors through conversations and lessons just what it is like to be a pupil at Bunbury Primary school. I feel incredibly privileged to work with such an inspirational group of professionals who on a daily basis uphold our schools vision for primary education.

I would also personally like to thank you as parents for the support you have shown us over the past few days. From bringing back books from previous years, supportive comments passed via email and at the gate and the general love which has been shown towards the school, it is all very much appreciated and has meant a great deal to the staff.





Despite our Ofsted inspection we continued with our art workshops with Jon Clayton, artist in residence, in year 6 this week. The artwork created as part of the 2 day workshop can only be described as amazing and we look forward to sharing it with you at the earliest opportunity. The children thoroughly enjoyed working on large canvases along with individual pieces of the church which are linked to our history topic for this half term in year 6.



Our learning across the school for the spring term is based around the following text: Timelines. Throughout the school children will be looking at different periods within history comparing it with life today, finding out key facts and knowledge of that time and exploring through all areas of the curriculum what it was like during this time. We

look forward to inviting you once again back into the school at the end of the term to share our learning experiences.

This week we also welcome Olivia-Mai and her family into our reception class, we very much hope they enjoy being part of the Bunbury family and we look forward to being part of your learning journey over the forthcoming years.

School Payments/Cashless Office (from 01/04/2020)

As you will be aware, our preferred method for you to make payments for your child's trips, out of school club bookings and if applicable, school lunches is via our secure online system, SchoolMoney.

This efficient system was introduced to enable both school and parent to experience a more streamlined, cost-effective way to manage school payments.

From the 1st April 2020, the school office will no longer accept cash or cheque payments. All payments are to be made online via your child's SchoolMoney account. For many, this change will have no affect. For those who currently pay by cash or cheque, I encourage you to logon to your child's SchoolMoney account to ensure the smooth running in this transition. Cash payments will only be accepted for charitable donations e.g own clothes days/sponsorships and for hot snack at break times.

If you encounter problems when logging into your account, please contact Mrs Waring in the school office who will be happy to help.

Parent SIMS registration

Finally, may I ask that all Parent/Carers complete the Parent SIMS registration as soon as possible so that we can ensure all contact details and information held for your child/children are correct. Once registered, please access and confirm that all details held are correct by either submitting or amending the data held before submitting. If you are experiencing any difficulties, please contact Mrs Waring in the school office.

We only use websites that an adult has chosen or knows about.

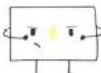


We can write polite and friendly emails to people we know.
