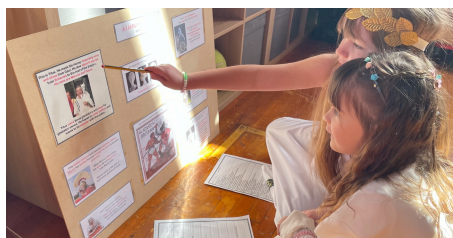

Schools Fest

As you will be aware Schools Fest is back! This year it will take place week beginning **16th May**. From 16th-20th May 2022 we will be hosting, a whole week of exciting outdoor challenges, incorporating physical games and expressive arts. There are multiple different activities which we are offering the children, including hiring a 7.5 metre climbing wall, Archery, Kayaking and drama, drumming and dance workshops. Activities will develop the children's self-belief, resilience, co-operation, and problem-solving skills. Education is more than the acquisition of knowledge and by improving young people's skills, values, relationships, and personal development, we can significantly enhance learning and achievement.

Decades week: 28th March - 1st April

Despite this half term being only 5 weeks in length we have lots of exciting activities planned for the children. To start our Platinum Jubilee Celebrations and to end our Spring term history theme we will be holding a decades week from **Monday 28th March**. During this week each class will look more in depth at people, places, art, music and events from their allocated decade from the Queens 70 year reign. The following decades will be explored further by each of the classes:

Reception – 1970's

Year 4 – 1990's

To end the week, on Friday 1st April we will have a Decades Dress up day which will end with all children and staff invited to dress up as a famous person from their decade or in the fashions, styles, culture or events from their decade!

Decades Disco: Thursday 31st March

To celebrate our work on decades as part of our work on the Platinum Jubilee we will be holding a decades disco for the children after school on **Thursday 31st March**. This will end our decades week when each class will be learning about a decade from the Queens reign. All children are able to come in decade costumes to the disco should they wish to as well as on our decades day on Friday 1st April.

The disco will take place in the school hall at the following times.

6.00 - 6.45pm for Reception and KS1
7.00 - 7.45pm for KS2

There will be a £3 cost per pupil for the disco which can be made via School Money. Children will not require any further money on the evening as the price will include entry as well as a refreshments for all children. Music will kindly be provided by DJ Mr Lee Gordon.

Please can we ensure that all children are wearing correct school uniform for the service and that school hoodies are not worn on this day as part of the uniform.

Uniform

Prior to half term I had noticed that standards in uniform have slipped for some of the children in school. There are though a number of children always dressed smartly and wearing the correct uniform and I thank those parents for upholding the expectations that we have.

There has been an increase in children wearing trainers and boots as well as items which are not part of the school uniform we list. At present I am permitting the children to wear their PE hooded sweatshirts within school to keep warm - this will remain in place until the Easter holidays. We also permit non-branded school hoodies to be worn but these must be black and not show a logo or fashion brand name.

This term we will be focusing on the value of forgiveness. Each week we will be rewarding those children who have demonstrated this value during the school week.

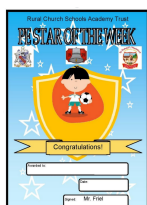
